PRINCIPAL REPORT

Compulsory School Attendance

"If a student misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school they'll have missed over a year of school."

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain meaningful friendships with other children.

What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children over the age of six years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- gives students time to greet their friends before class
- reduces classroom disruption.



What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence.

My child won't go to school. What should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

Working in Partnership

At Crystal Creek Public School we recognise that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school. We enjoy working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.

MR DAVIS'S PARENT TIPS OF THE WEEK

Homework tips

These tips are relevant for all students Kindergarten to Year 12.

- Ask your child about their homework, know what they are learning about and when assignments are due.
- Get into a routine of doing homework at a set time, ideally a little each day.
- Have a set place where children can do

their homework, with the equipment they'll need–pens and pencils, highlighters, scissors, glue, scrap paper, ruler, calculator, printing paper, computer and internet access, a printer.

- If there's no set homework, encourage your child to do some reading. For younger children, it's great for them to read aloud to you. For older ones, ask them to tell you about what they have read.
- Don't jump in and give answers, homework is about helping children become independent learners.
- Turn off TVs, mobiles and other devices so there are no disruptions.
- If your child is having difficulty with their homework, contact their class teacher for help.


STEWART HOUSE DONATION DRIVE

Getting involved in School Banking is easy!

All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

1. Online

Visit <u>www.commbank.com.au/schoolbanking</u> and click on the link to open a Youthsaver account.

2. In branch

Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week on School Banking day using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

School Banking day is Tuesday. Each week you need to hand it into the school office.
